Program committee members work closely with colleagues who share their interests and concerns, and have the chance to use - and develop - expertise in interest areas ranging from alternative careers to zoning.

Most committees meet monthly for lectures, tours, or discussions. Some committees sponsor exhibitions and educational events. Others study proposed legislation, development schemes, and urban issues, and then, working with the Board of Directors and Executive Director, communicate the Chapter's position in public testimony or letters to government officials. All members are encouraged to participate in at least one committee. Upcoming committee meeting dates are published in the e-Calendar sent to members each Friday afternoon.

PROGRAM COMMITTEES

- Architecture Dialogue**
Formulates programs addressing architectural design issues, trends, and the state of architecture today
- Architecture For Education**
Serves members primarily working on educational facilities to keep abreast of activity in the field.
- Architecture For Justice**
Serves members focused on the design of judicial, correctional, and law enforcement building types.
- Architecture of Hospitality**
Seeks to inform and explore the current trends in the Hospitality industry with emphasis on interior/exterior environment, development potential and client related issues.
- Banking & Finance**
Discuss ideas, design trends costs, and technical developments in banking and financial institutions.
- Building Codes**
Addresses specific Building Department and Code changes such as handicapped accessibility and housing
- Building Enclosures**
Promotes and encourages discussion. on all matters concerning building enclosures and the related science.
- Cultural Facilities**
Learn about & participate in activities of museums, historic houses and sites, libraries, zoos, & botanical gardens, performance spaces & related institutions.
- Design Awards**
Oversees the Chapter's design awards programs for completed works, interiors, and unbuilt projects competitions.

A forum for the interests and activities of students, interns, associates, and new architects
- COTE (Ctte. on the Environment)**
Helps architects develop an expertise on sustainable design and building technology issues in an environment
- Health Facilities**
Serves members concerned with all aspects of the architect's responsibility in designing health facilities.
- Historic Buildings**
Monitors the Landmarks Commission, presents testimony, and arranges informational and technical meetings.
- Housing**
Examines the state of housing production in terms of its design, the constraints of regulation, and financing.
- Elder Housing Subcommittee**
- Technology**
Provides a forum for the exchange of ideas regarding systems availability costs, and other practice issues.
- Interiors**
Serves Chapter members interested in interior design.
- International**
Provides a forum for for those engaged in or seeking international work and provides foreign architects in NYC a connection to the AIA community.
- Marketing & Public Relations**
Organizes programs to inform and assist Chapter members in marketing and public relations initiatives.

- Minority Resources in Architecture**
Provides a forum for minority members to discuss issues of concern and sponsor events of interest.
- Planning & Urban Design**
Works with agencies to review proposed changes to the Zoning Resolution and examines urban design issues.
- Professional Practice**
Provides a forum for exchange of information about running a professional practice.
- Public Architecture**
Organizes a collaboration of architects employed in public agencies with those commissioned by the public sector. Monitors contracting and procurement issues.
- Roundtable**
An opportunity for long-term members of the Chapter to meet regularly and participate in Chapter affairs.
- Transportation & Infrastructure**
Addresses transportation and infrastructure issues.
- Women in Architecture**
Support and empowerment of women in the architecture profession through example and achievement.
