Frank called the meeting to order and the following is a summary of the discussion:

1. Calvin Tsao, the AIA NY Chapter Vice President for Design Excellence asked Frank to have the justice committee nominate a candidate deserving of the Chapter's "Certificate of Excellence" award for one of the three categories: design; professional development; and public outreach. The committee's discussion this morning focused on several candidates: Rafael Vinoly; Tom Phifer; Ed Feiner (GSA); and Harry Cobb. By a unanimous vote, the committee will recommend Ed Feiner, GSA's leader who spearheaded their "Design Excellence" program. Frank will write a recommendation letter to Calvin Tsao, which will be presented by Peter Krasnow this coming Tuesday morning, March 18<sup>th</sup>.
2. Ed Rosen discussed a Cornell University crossroads speech: "The City is the Greatest Work of Art" by Harry Cobb, at a time when the college was considering the restructuring of their architectural department. A copy of this speech will be distributed to those that attended today's meeting. This presentation is in line with committee members receiving one hour of continuing education credits.
3. The "Security in the Civic Realm" conference is currently scheduled for Thursday, 22 May 2003, with the subtitle reflecting the new agenda: "Impact of 9-11 on Architecture. Melissa will confirm the venue of the "Winter Garden" at Battery Park City this week or another venue will be chosen. Grand Central Station has a room available on the balcony, which will be explored by Ed Rosen. Guest speakers will included either Larry Graham or John Zucati of Brookfield Properties, and Raphael Pelli. One additional speaker will be announced to focus on public spaces around New York City (landscaping, transportation, security, etc.). An abstract will be forwarded shortly.
4. "Art in Public Space – Images of Justice", planned for this fall to present goals and ideas for introducing art into public buildings, including new and historic courthouses, has been tabled for discussion at our next meeting.
