The meeting was called to order by Frank and a discussion regarding our Spring Security Conference was discussed:

1. Frank attended the AIA NYC Chapter Committee Chair retreat recently. The committees were reorganized to be headed by one of AIA's four vice presidents. The justice committee will be under Daria Pizzetta, and include interiors, urban design, and awards committees, among others. Two events were discussed that may include the justice committee: a book party sponsored by the cultural affairs committee to celebrate Stephen Kliment's new book "African American Architects". The second event suggested by Frank, was to collaborate with other committees for the security conference scheduled for this spring.

2. Peter made the committee aware of National AIA Justice Committee's security conference plans scheduled for this fall and he will obtain information from Barbara Nadel to see if a joint effort for this conference could be set in NYC.

4. Ken suggested holding two separate conferences: Highlighting NYC architects' current courthouse projects with an evening in the spring at the Tweed Courthouse and tour of the building; the second one, a security

conference could be planned for the fall around the anniversary of the September 11th attacks, in conjunction with the national justice committee, or on our own. The Tweed event was moved from April 18th to May 23rd.

4. Marcy will contact the "Security Design Coalition" assembled by the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) to obtain an update on their plans for their similar security event scheduled for this year, and consider inviting them to participate in ours.

5. "A New World Trade Center exhibit is currently displaying design solutions worldwide for rebuilding the downtown site. It is running from January 17th thru February 16th:
