**Eligibility**

Architecture located anywhere designed by AIA New York Chapter members or by registered architects practicing in New York City. Architecture located in New York City (five boroughs) designed by registered architects practicing anywhere. Associate AIA New York Chapter members may submit in the Projects category only. Built work must have been completed after January 1, 2001. Unbuilt projects must have been initiated after January 1, 2001.

**Categories**

The three categories for AIA New York Chapter Design Awards are Architecture, Interior Architecture, and Projects. Work submitted in the Architecture and Interior Architecture categories must be completed. The Projects category recognizes unbuilt architecture and urban design as well as theoretical or conceptual work, temporary installations, land art, and research. Projects cannot have been undertaken for academic credit. Historic Preservation work is encouraged in all categories.

**Exhibition**

Award recipients shall provide two 18" x 24" presentation boards in landscape orientation, laminated on 1/2" gatorboard, for display in the Design Awards Exhibition at the Center for Architecture. Selected award recipients will also be invited to submit models and video animations for display. Digital photographs of models shall be submitted for review by September 22, 2005. Presentation boards, models, and videos shall be delivered to the Center for Architecture by September 30, 2005.

**Publicity**

The AIA New York Chapter intends to publicize the Design Awards in various media: a special Awards Issue of *Oculus* in early 2006; the Design Awards Exhibition at the Center for Architecture from October 11 to December 3, 2005; the Chapter website; a Design Awards DVD; and a luncheon honoring award recipients in Spring 2006. The Chapter intends to publish an image from all entries on its website and show them in a video at the Design Awards Exhibition.

Each entrant must clear all elements of each submission for re-use, unrestricted publicity, and reproduction by the AIA New York Chapter. Release forms signed by the owners and copyright holders of submitted material will be required. Submitting a project shall constitute the submitting architect's permission to publish the project regardless of its juried outcome. Entrants are responsible for any royalties or copyright/photographic fees.

**Submission Process**

When the Chapter receives a completed entry form with payment, it will send the entrant a registration number and a registration package, which includes submission requirements. Entrants may pick up registration packages at the Center for Architecture to avoid delays. The AIA New York Chapter will not be held responsible for delays in delivery of registration materials. Each submission must fit within an 8-1/2" x 11" binder supplied by the entrant, with the registration number on the top right hand outside corner. Submissions that are late or do not meet the stated requirements will be disqualified. Entry fees are non-refundable. All deadlines are for receipt of required material at the Center for Architecture, not for its postmark.

**Digital Images**

In addition to drawings and photographs, digital images will be required on CD. Registration package will state detailed requirements. Slides will not be required or accepted.

**Credits**

The architect or firm of record, associate architects, project team, consultants, client, and general contractor shall be credited on submission forms. Client names will be withheld from publication upon request. For restoration, renovation, and adaptive reuse of existing buildings, the original architect shall be identified, if known. Submissions of work done as an employee or consultant must include a release from a principal of the firm acknowledging that the submitting architect had primary design responsibility, and that project credits are correct.

**Return of Submissions**

Submissions must be picked up at the Center for Architecture between October 14 and October 28, 2005. Those remaining after October 28, 2005 will be discarded. Submissions that include a self-addressed mailer, with registration number written on it, will be mailed back. Winning submissions may be retained until the publication of the special Awards Issue of *Oculus*. The AIA New York Chapter will not be held responsible for the condition of returned submissions.

**Entry Form and Fees**

The following form and entry fees are due at the Center for Architecture by 5:00 PM, Friday, August 26, 2005. For a supplemental late fee of \$35 per submission, forms and entry fees can be delivered to the Center for Architecture by 5:00 PM, Monday, September 12, 2005.
