2019 AIANY ENYA ARE Scholarship

Overview

The purpose of the scholarship award is to recognize the significant contributions of members, at an early stage of their career, to the AIA New York Chapter, and to provide resources to encourage young professionals to become licensed professionals.

Award details

One scholarship will be awarded in 2019. Awardees will receive:

- Exam registration reimbursement up to \$1,410, excluding NCARB record fees This ceiling is based on the cost of registering for six divisions of the Architect Registration Examination (ARE 5.0) as of October 1, 2019. Candidates must take six exam divisions between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2021 to recoup the maximum possible compensation. Exam retakes are eligible for reimbursement, but scholarship recipients will be compensated for no more than six exam sittings.
- ENYA Scholarship Winner Certificate

Criteria and Eligibility

For an applicant to be eligible for this award, both of the following must apply:

- AIA New York member in good standing
- AXP enrollee with at least one ARE 5.0 division scheduled and paid for as of **November 5, 2019**.

Applicants should demonstrate more than one of the following attributes:

- Outstanding achievement in the creation, development and delivery of creative programs for interns, Associates, and/or young architect members of AIA New York;
- Significant contributions at an early stage of career to the profession and/or community;
- Exemplary involvement in community and/or professional organizations;
- Passion for pursuit of registration; and/or
- Connection to the broader professional community (as demonstrated through the letters of recommendation described in **Submission Requirements**)

Awards are not based on financial need, as much as they are based on contributions the individual has made to their profession, their community and/or AIA New York.

Nomination

Applicants must be nominated by an Architect, Associate, or International Associate member of AIA New York.

Submission Requirements

The application must include:

- Completed ENYA ARE Scholarship Application form
- One letter of nomination (limited to 1 page) *Please see Nomination section for eligibility of writers.*
- One personal statement of contribution written by the applicant (limited to 1 page)
- One biography and/or resume (limited to 2 pages)
- Two letters of recommendation (limited to 1 page each) Letters should come from individuals who can speak to the candidate's accomplishments outlined in the personal statement. No more than one letter from each company/organization. The ideal candidate will have a variety of letters from their firm, a community organization, a member of the architecture profession, and/or a mentor.
- Proof of exam registration via a copy of Prometric payment receipt

Submission Instructions

To ensure the fair and thorough evaluation of all candidates for the ENYA ARE Scholarship, the materials must be submitted in the manner described below.

• Submission materials must be within an 8-1/2" x 11" electronic format, combined into a single PDF of no more than ten pages total, and have a maximum file size of **5MB**.

By making a submission, the applicant grants permission to the AIANY to reproduce and publicly display submission material if the applicant receives an award. Materials submitted will not be returned to the applicant. All entries submitted without the required materials will be disqualified.
